

Where to Fish in Moray

This leaflet gives details of the Angling Associations and tackle shops where you can buy permits to fish the Rivers Findhorn, Nairn and Lossie.

The **River Findhorn** flowing from its source high in the Monadhliath Mountains 60 miles to the outflow at Findhorn on the Moray Firth, is a most attractive salmon river, with a succession of deep pools and fast runs throughout its length. **Forres Angling Association** control four miles of double bank fishing on the lower River Findhorn.

The **River Lossie** flows northwards through Moray to Elgin, entering the Moray Firth at Lossiemouth. The River Lossie can provide some excellent salmon and sea trout fishing.
